The Center for Fine Art Photography presents its newest exhibition, **Documentary**. This exhibition is on display in the Center's gallery from July 31 – August 22, 2009. Thirty-three photographers representing, France, Germany, Greece, Japan, United Kingdom and the United States are exhibiting their work. The opening reception is on Friday August 7th from 6 – 9 PM.



Documentary photography has the power to tell stories untold, create social change, awaken emotions and reveal the intimate and unseen. This exhibition is reality in its most private moments; haunting, hopeful and inspiring.

Juror, Ed Kashi, is a photojournalist, filmmaker and educator dedicated to documenting the social and political issues that define our times. His images have appeared in National Geographic, the New York Times Magazine, Time, Newsweek and many other domestic and international publications. Mr. Kashi will be giving a public talk as well as conducting an intensive three day workshop during August 20 – August 23.

Founded in 2004 to promote the art of photography through exhibitions and education, the Center is a nonprofit organization supported by donations, grants and memberships. The Center for Fine Art Photography currently has more than 1,300 members representing 33 countries worldwide. Although its headquarters and gallery are in Fort Collins, Colorado, an on-line gallery gives photographers and photography enthusiasts from all over the globe an opportunity to engage with the Center.
